A SMART IEP goal will be realistic for the student to achieve and lay out how the student will accomplish it. Breaking down the components of SMART goals into their specific elements can make them easier to write.

Determining Measurable Annual Goals in an IEP

Therefore, you need specific, measurable goals for writing in your child's IEP, like those below. The example IEP goals for written expression must be changed to meet your child's specific needs, so you need to learn how to create good goals. The examples make more sense once you know what a measurable goal looks like.

IEP Goals for Written Expression or Difficulty with Writing

Developing IEP Goals for Writing As with goals in any content area, growth in the area of written expression needs to be determined first by establishing a baseline. This can be done using writing prompts, fluency probes and spelling word lists as well as other standardized, standard based and curriculum designed assessments.

Writing Measurable Annual Goals Measurable annual goals are statements that describe what a child with a disability can reasonably be expected to accomplish within a 12-month period in the child's education program. There should be a direct relationship between the measurable annual goals and the needs identified in the PLAAFP.

While reading a passage orally, STUDENT will demonstrate self-correcting of errors by pausing in the text, using context clues and phonetic skills, and then rereading the phrase for meaning 90% accuracy 4 of 5 trials. While reading orally, STUDENT will demonstrate reading fluency by making no more than 2 errors in a one hundred word passage at instructional level 4 of 5 trials.

The IEP team must be able to tell if the goal has been reached, because the child's performance can be counted, seen, heard, or somehow measured. Not surprisingly, writing IEP goals that are measurable challenges many an IEP team. You may find Wrightslaw's resource on Smart IEPs very helpful.

Why Is Writing Good IEP Goals So Difficult?

Write one goal that is specific, measurable, uses action words, is realistic and relevant, and is time-limited. Use words that describe the intended outcome. For example, "Mary will be able to . . ." Write the performances that will show that your child has mastered the goal.
